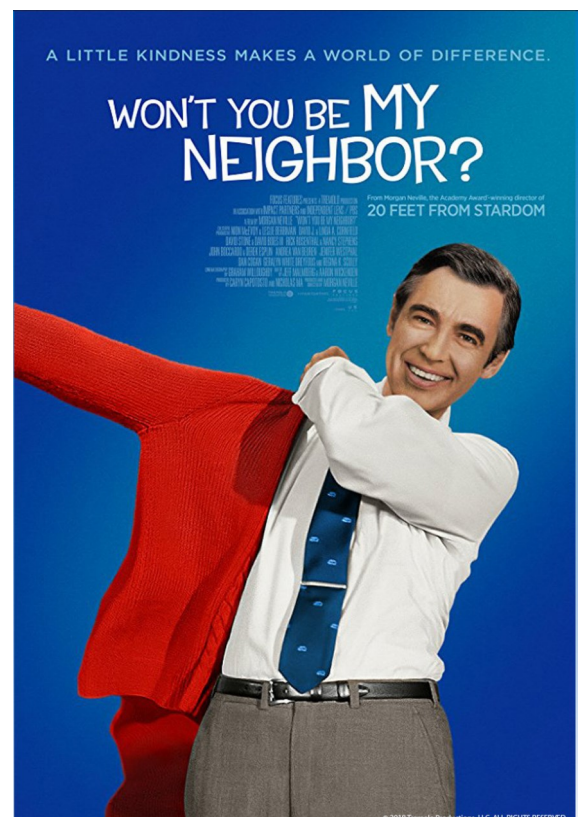

Diabetes Support Group

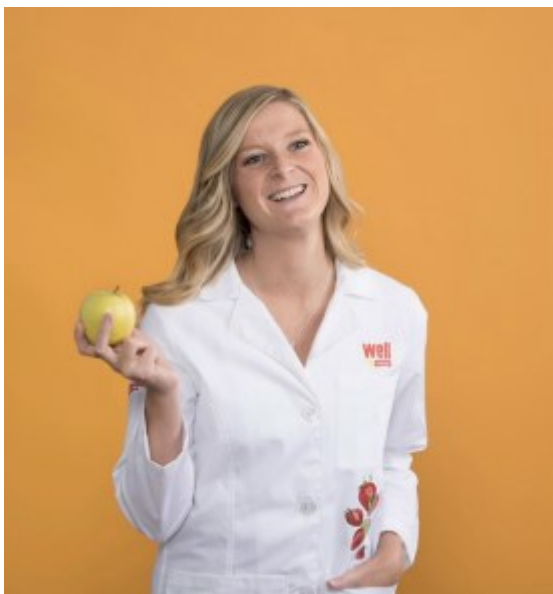

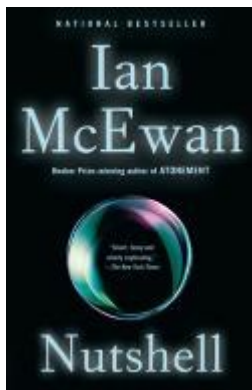

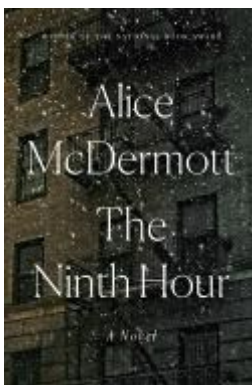


Nutshell

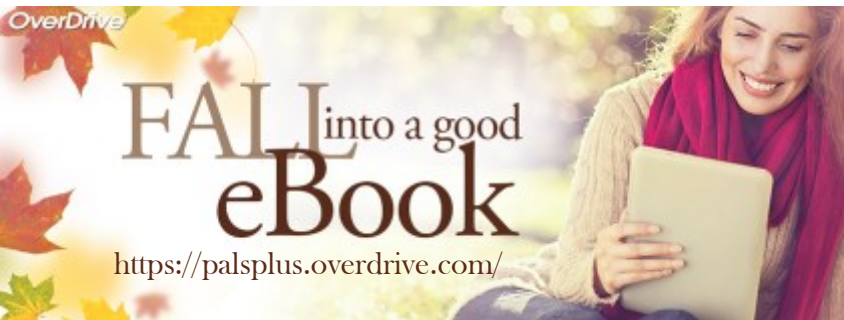
Gentle Yoga with Michelle
