## ***Rails to Sterling Forest: The History of the Erie's Greenwood Lake Division***

Wednesday, September 30 – Virtual Event

Join us for a virtual presentation on the Greenwood Lake Division of the Erie Railroad. The railroad to Greenwood Lake was approximately 50 miles but it had an amazing variety of operations. It was born as the Montclair Railway amid political squabbles and questionable financial maneuvers, and despite fights with rival railroads, bankruptcies, fistfights, receiverships, and shady deals. Control of the line was acquired by the Erie in 1878 and became the road's new Greenwood Lake Division. As a freight hauler, the railroad transported thousands of tons of iron ore south from the Ramapo Mountains and helped create the Wanaque Reservoir. Its passenger trains helped to establish Greenwood Lake as a major resort destination.

## For Film Fans

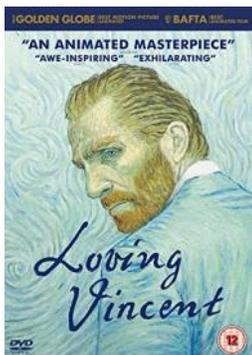
